	The COVID-19 pandemic prompted an increased use of telemedicine to connect providers with their patients. To make the transition to technology-delivered care easier, Texas officials adopted waivers and changes expanding the number of Medicaid services available through telemedicine. The significant shift in service delivery and demand due to the pandemic gave rise to new program integrity issues. Dr. Ted Spears, chief medical officer for The Texas Health and Human Services Office of Inspector General, will discuss potential areas of program integrity risk in the utilization of telemedicine.

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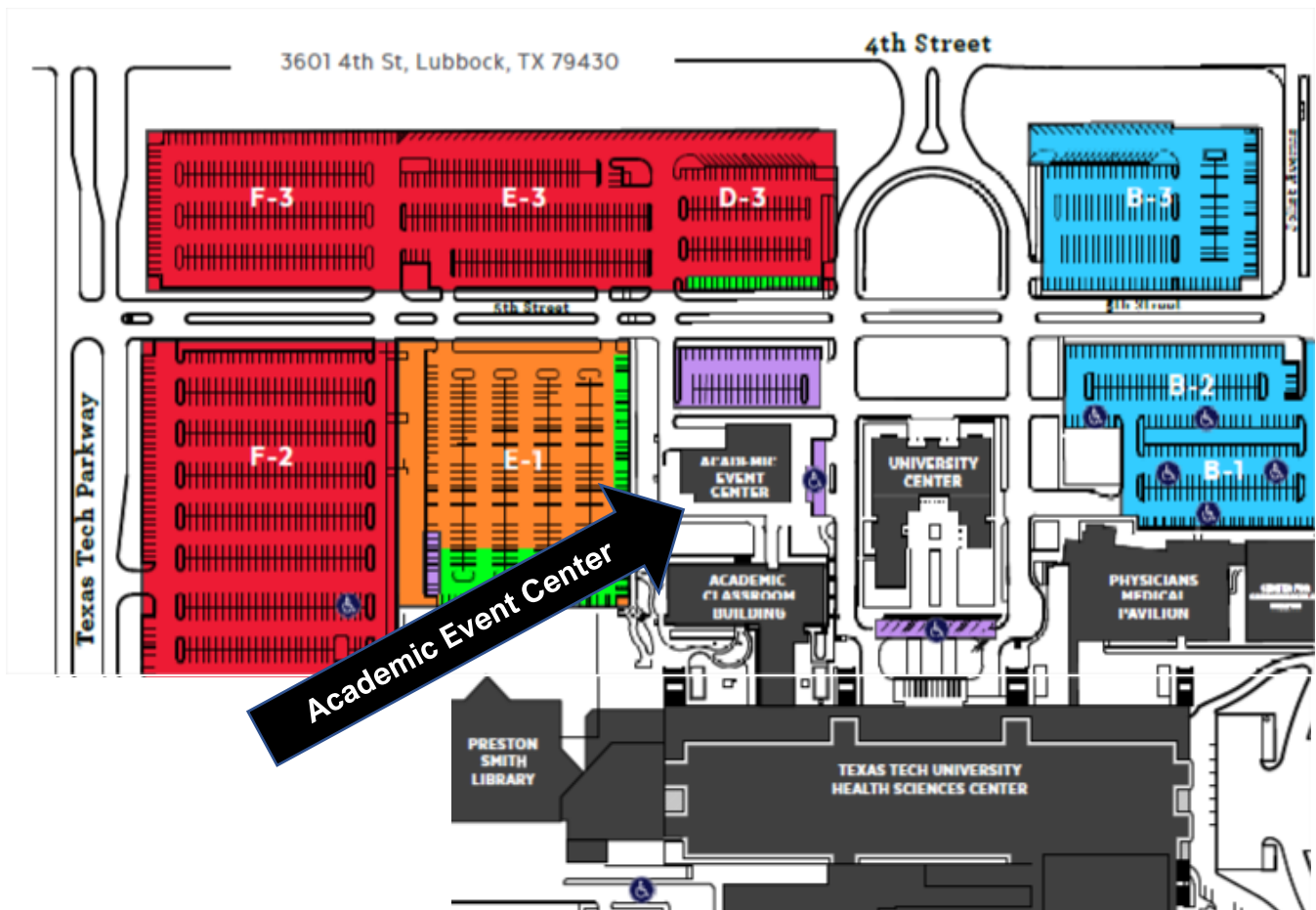
