### CLASS OF 2022 CELEBRATED



On May 21, the TTUHSC Jerry H. Hodge School of Pharmacy Class of 2022 received their PharmD degrees. Of the 127 graduates who made up the class, 31 will go on to residency programs, four will go on to fellowship programs, and 20 received PharmD/MBA dual degrees.

Latresa Billings, PharmD, delivered the commencement address. Billings is president of the Texas Society of Health Systems Pharmacists (TSHP) and an alumna of TTUHSC's Post-Graduate Residency Program in Dallas.

The commencement ceremony marked the end of the tenure of the second dean of the school, Quentin Smith, PhD, who led the school for the last ten years, and welcomed our third dean, Grace Kuo, PharmD, PhD.

An award ceremony for 2022 graduates was held on Friday, May 20 and history was made when Madeline Scarbrough was the first student in TTUHSCSOP history to receive two prestigious honors. ## PROFESSOR CO-EDITS COLLECTIVE BOOK ON NEURAL REPAIR



Vardan Karamyan, TTUHSCSOP Tenured Full Professor and Vice Chair of Pharmaceutical Sciences, served as co-editor on a collective book, Methods in Molecular Biology Book focusing on Neural Repair, which is currently in press.

The book is a comprehensive technical synopsis of cutting-edge techniques to measure neural repair and functional recovery after stroke. Many of the techniques support stroke research currently funded by NINDS and NIDA. The book will represent at least 31 labs in nine countries on four continents who made a special effort to share their techniques and better our collective science.



## STUDENT HELPING DEVELOP IMMUNIZATION GUIDES FOR CVS



Minsu Kim, P3 on the Amarillo campus, has spent his summer working as a pharmacist intern for CVS with TTUHSCSOP Alumna, Robin Blasingame, PharmD. During the internship, Kim was presented with the opportunity to help create and write a new immunization information guide and he decided to take it on.

Together with an intern from Perdue University, Kim is working to create two different immunization guide documents that will be used in all CVS pharmacies, one for the public and one for pharmacy employees.

The public guide will be a QR code the public can scan to access common things for patients to know about and watch out for related to immunizations. The code will be posted in several spots, including on band aids. The pharmacy employee guide will take the form of a quick reference conversation guide that includes clinical pearls regarding immunizations that both technicians and pharmacists can use.

At this time, they have created a generalized guide for customers and a more complex guide for pharmacists with talking points for the Shingrix and Pneumonia vaccines and are working with CVS marketing to review and edit. The team meets with corporate every week to brainstorm what immunizations to cover next and specific patient groups to focus on.



## RESEARCHERS RECEIVE PATENT





Sanjay K. Srivastava, PhD, TTUHSCSOP Distinguished Professor, Chairman and Associate Dean of the Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences, and Sharavan Ramachandran, PhD, a former TTUHSC graduate student and research scientist, were recently awarded a U.S. patent entitled: "Compositions and Methods for Treating Cancer."

This innovation, developed out of the TTUHSC School of Pharmacy Abilene campus, covers the development of Pimavanserin, a promising new drug candidate for treatment of pancreatic and brain cancers.

This novel technology has potential application as an oncology therapeutic with an expedited path to market as a repurposed drug. This compound has exhibited significant tumor growth suppression (e.g., up to 77%) via inhibition of Akt/Gli1 signaling and induction of autophagy mediated apoptosis with proof of concept achieved in vivo for pancreatic and brain cancers.

## DO YOU KNOW: How to Disclose Your Invention?

The Office of Research Commercialization (ORC) serves the Texas Tech University System (TTUS) by helping to move research discoveries from the university laboratory to the marketplace. This includes helping researchers and industry partners translate innovations developed out of the SOP into commercial applications and successfully bring them to market.



**When should you disclose?** When you believe you have discovered something new that has possible commercial value, or when the terms of a sponsored research project require disclosure of any invention.

What if you're not sure if something is new or has commercial value? Disclosing to the ORC can help determine next steps. All disclosures received by the ORC are assessed for intellectual property and commercial potential. You can also contact the ORC to discuss your idea before disclosing.

**How to disclose?** Our online form makes it easy to confidentially report your innovation to the ORC in advance of any public disclosure or publication, which can impact future patentability.
