Pharmacy Practice Residency

The Pharmacy Practice Residency is a 12 month program designed to develop general skills in inpatient and ambulatory patient care, and pharmacy practice management. Three pharmacy practice residency positions will be offered. Pharmacy residents are based at Presbyterian Hospital of Dallas and are affiliated with the Texas Tech School of Pharmacy.

Pharmacists completing this residency program will be competent practitioners of pharmaceutical care as practiced in an integrated clinical environment. A major focus of this residency program involves working as a member of a health care team, communicating with and educating physicians, nurses, and patients on appropriate medication therapy. During this program, it is expected that the resident will grow professionally and will exhibit a personal philosophy of professional growth and commitment to the profession.

Residents are required to complete 10 rotations and complete and present one major project. An optional teaching certificate is available to residents who would like to pursue academia or just improve their teaching skills. Available rotations include Ambulatory Care, Internal Medicine, Critical Care, Drug Information, Hospital Pharmacy Management, Emergency Medicine, Informatics, Neonatal Intensive Care, Infectious Disease, Psychiatry, Nephrology, and Hematology/Oncology.

Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center School of Pharmacy

The Texas Tech School of Pharmacy was established by the Texas Legislature in 1993 and is part of the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center. The TT SOP is the first publicly funded pharmacy school to be built in the US in 40 years. Founded upon the idealism that tomorrow's pharmacists must be independent thinking and technologically advanced, all education and training utilize problem-based learning techniques with a strong emphasis on computer literacy. All course materials are maintained on the School's World Wide Web servers. The main campus for the school of pharmacy (pictured below) is located in Amarillo and has a state of the art facility with high tech, online classrooms. Regional campuses are located in Dallas/Ft Worth, Lubbock, and El Paso. The first class graduated in May 2000.

The Dallas/Fort Worth Regional campus (pictured below) was established in 1999, and currently resides on the Dallas VAMC campus. Twenty full-time faculty, over 25 adjunct clinical faculty, and two distance learning classrooms support the education and training of 145 students in their last 2 years of pharmacy school, along with seven PGY-1 and seven PGY-2 residents.



Requirements:

- Graduate of accredited school of pharmacy
- Active Texas pharmacy license, or be eligible for licensure in Texas
- Candidates will be required to consent in writing to undergo a background check prior to employment

Salary & Benefits:

The stipend for one year is \$48,000. Benefits include paid vacation/holiday leave, a health care and retirement benefit package, travel funding to one national professional meeting and one regional residency conference, and an appointment as an Assistant Instructor at the Texas Tech School of Pharmacy. Texas has no state income tax.

Required Rotations:

- Internal medicine (2 months)
- Critical Care
- Drug information
- Hospital Management
- Ambulatory Care (longitudinal)
