Program Designed For

Healthcare providers who wish to increase their knowledge of caring for cancer patients, including oncologists, hematologists, radiologists, pathologists, general practice physicians, internists, family practitioners, researchers, residents, students, advanced nurse practitioners, physician assistants, nurses and social workers.

Objectives

Upon the completion of the conference, the participant should be able to:

- ◆ Identify prevention and treatment strategies for lymphedema.
- ◆ Discuss oncology patients at risk for the development of lymphedema.

- ◆ Identify the implications of intraperitoneal chemotherapy for ovarian cancer.
- ◆ Discuss the management of patients receiving intraperitoneal chemotherapy.

- ◆ Evaluate the impact of nutritional choices in the prevention of cancer.
- ◆ Discuss nutritional research about prevention of some cancers.

- ◆ Differentiate melanoma, basal cell and squamous cell malignant lesions.
- ◆ Assess the pathologic interpretations of common skin cancers.

- ◆ Discuss the ethical considerations of pain management in end of life care.
- ◆ Evaluate current pain methods to provide effective pain management.

- ◆ Evaluate the effectiveness of colorectal cancer screening in the prevention and early stage diagnosis of colorectal cancers.
- ◆ Discuss the benefit versus risk ratio of colonoscopy screening (CRC).

- ◆ Recognize family history that suggests a possibility of a hereditary risk for cancer.
- ◆ Identify the high-risk genetics / hereditary risks of developing cancers.
