

**Teaching Appointment Guidelines for
School of Pharmacy Faculty Member to the
School of Medicine**

- I. **Clinical Pharmacist** - this category normally would be used for appointment to a clinical department (e.g. Medicine, Family Practice) and normally would be used to acknowledge participation in teaching activities as defined below.
- A. Qualifications would ordinarily include the following:
1. Educational Qualifications:
 - a. Pharm.D. degree
 2. Professional Qualifications:
 - a. Licensure to practice pharmacy in the State of Texas
 - b. Membership in appropriate professional societies
- B. School of Medicine responsibilities will ordinarily include participating in the clinical training of 3rd and 4th year medical students and residents in the general areas of pharmacokinetics, pharmaco-dynamics, and drug interactions.
- C. These appointments would be considered for renewal annually during the 11th month of each fiscal year.

Additional Considerations

- There would be only one level of appointment and the appointment would be Clinical Pharmacist, Department of _____, TTU SOM.
- Salary for faculty members in this series would be paid from the School of Pharmacy budget and/or non-medical school funds.
- This series does not preclude the use of other School of Medicine faculty appointment series for appointment of School of Pharmacy faculty to the School of Medicine faculty, providing candidates for the other series meet the specified qualifications of the series and will perform functions in the SOM consistent with the series.
