### Objectives:

#### Updates in Hypertension (0.1 CEUs)

- Identify updates to hypertension management
- Evaluate appropriate goals of therapy in special populations
- Relate impact of recent safety data concerning antihypertensives
- Design evidence-based treatment plans for patients with hypertension

#### Updates in Antiplatelet Therapy for Acute Coronary Syndromes (ACS) (0.1 CEUs)

- Review the current literature describing variable platelet response to clopidogrel.
- Review the pharmacology of prasugrel and ticagrelor.
- Discuss the evidence for use of prasugrel and ticagrelor in the management of ACS.
- Develop an appropriate antiplatelet strategy for the management of patients with ACS.

#### Anticoagulant Options in Atrial Fibrillation: An Update (0.1 CEUs)

- Compare and contrast the safety and efficacy of the new anticoagulation options with warfarin for use in non-valvular atrial fibrillation
- Evaluate the evidence for the new anticoagulants for use in non-valvular atrial fibrillation
- Describe dosing limitations of current therapies
- Determine place in therapy for each of the agents for use in non-valvular atrial fibrillation

#### Novel Oral Anticoagulants in the Prevention & Management of Venous Thromboembolism (VTE) (0.1 CEUs)

- Review and compare the pharmacology of dabigatran, rivaroxaban, and apixaban.
- Review the evidence evaluating the use of these agents in the primary prevention of VTE.
- Review the evidence supporting the use of these agents in the treatment of VTE.
- Develop an appropriate strategy for use of these agents in the prevention and treatment of VTE.

#### Learning to Precept Tomorrow's Pharmacist (0.3 CEUs)

- Describe the vision for the future practice of pharmacy and the impact it will have on development and delivery of pharmacy practice experiences
- Describe the critical role that orientation, feedback, and evaluation have on delivering excellent pharmacy practice experiences
- Discuss challenges that preceptors encounter while providing experiential education learning opportunities for students
