The profession of Pharmacy is a licensed profession that is regulated in the United States by each State's Board of Pharmacy. All 50 state pharmacy licensure board recognize the Doctor of Pharmacy degree from an Accreditation Council of Pharmacy Education (ACPE) accredited College of Pharmacy as fulfilling the academic requirements for pharmacist licensure. The ACPE maintains standards for Colleges of Pharmacy. The TTUHSC Jerry H. Hodge School of Pharmacy is an ACPE accredited School of Pharmacy.

Two pharmacist licensure exams are offered through the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP). One is the North American Pharmacy Licensure Exam (NAPLEX), which is common to all the states, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands. The other is the Multi-state Pharmacy Jurisprudence Exam (MPJE) (pharmacy law exam) which is state specific and contains questions about federal law and state law for the state in which the candidate plans to practice. There are 49 boards of pharmacy which require passing the MPJE as a component of licensure. Only five boards do not utilize the MPJE for their law examinations, Arkansas, California, Idaho, Puerto Rico, and Virgin Islands. The TTUHSC Jerry H. Hodge School of Pharmacy law curriculum prepares candidates for the Federal law and Texas state law MPJE exam. Candidates are advised to check with state pharmacy boards of the states in which they want to practice for other requirements since they may change from time to time.
