- Breast cancer is the second highest female mortality rate in Texas for all races and ethnicities, except for Hispanics. Interestingly, Hale County is a rural underserved county in West Texas which experiences a lower rate of cancer. The research team led by **Dr. Hafiz Khan** conducted a study to determine the relationship between sociodemographic variables and breast cancer outcomes in underserved Hale County which contributed to the highest mortality rate in Texas.
