Following graduation, he joined the faculty of the Department of Surgery at TTUHSC with a commitment to ongoing clinical and educational work at Tenwek in pediatric surgery via the PAACS / CO-SECSA accredited general surgery residency program.

Global medical needs are overwhelming and seemingly impossible to meet. Many give generously of both time and effort to mitigate the burden of disease in low and middle income countries (LMIC), but what is the impact? The goal of this brief presentation is to provide a snapshot of how one organization and one hospital, in one region of one country is striving to meet greater needacross one amazing continent.
