Please join us as a group of TTUHSC MD/MPH students recount their March 2016 trip to Nicaragua to complete their Masters in Public Health (MPH) capstone practicum project.

In Nicaragua the group discovered one of the most beautiful and culturally-rich countries in Latin America. However, many of the country's residents lack access to basic resources such as clean water and health care. The MPH group's project assessed the prevalence of poor dental health in children and diabetes in adults residing in the state of Jinotega in northern Nicaragua.

By providing education and medical treatment to Jinotega's residents, the group aimed to make a positive impact on those who took part in the project over the two week period. This experience validated the students' interest in global medicine which they all hope to pursue in the future.
