Six Months in Addis Ababa: My Experience in Ethiopian Health Care presented by Holly Mulinder TTUHSC School of Medicine MD/MPH Class of 2018

Holly Mulinder is a second year medical student enrolled in the dual degree MD/MPH program at TTUHSC. At a young age, her family immigrated to the United States from England. The vast cultural differences between the two outwardly similar countries inspired her to learn more about diverse customs around the world. This led to her first international volunteer experience at The Baobab Home, a family-style orphanage in Tanzania. This experience left her with a desire to help improve health care in developing countries.

In January 2014, Holly had the opportunity to assist Dr. Rick Hodes with his mission to provide health care, including surgeries, to Ethiopians in need. This presentation will describe Holly's six-month experience with Dr. Rick at his clinic and the Mother Teresa Mission for the Destitute and Dying in Addis Ababa. She will share the stories of some specific patients who were treated for Pott's disease, severe scoliosis, congenital heart disease, and some of Dr. Rick's unique cases. She will also describe daily life in Addis and the challenges involved in providing health care in Ethiopia.
