

## Beyond Tourism: TTUHSC Making a Difference in Nicaragua

Dr. Patti J. Patterson is a Professor in the Department of Pediatrics, Medical Education, and Public Health at TTUHSC. She received her Medical Degree at the University of Texas Medical Branch in Galveston, Texas and received her Masters of Public Health at the University of Texas Health Science Center in Houston, Texas. She is board certified in both pediatrics and child abuse pediatrics. Dr. Patterson has been on 48 international medical trips.

Nicaragua is the second poorest country in the Western hemisphere. The people living in the remote, mountainous regions of the country have significant health problems, including high rates of maternal mortality, infant mortality, and cervical cancer. TTUHSC students and faculty have been working in this region for several years on programs to make a real difference for real people.
