She has previously served as the Maternal, Child, and Adolescent Health Director at Childbirth Survival International, a global grassroots nonprofit. Through Ms. Suedi's scholarly engagement she promotes addressing challenges in low- and middle-income countries by elevating the social status of women and girls through political will, practical leadership, and increased investments in health and education.
