Dr. Zhang received her doctorate in health services research from Old Dominion University College of Health Sciences. Her pre-doctoral education was completed at Beijing University of Traditional Chinese Medicine (Bachelor degree) and China Academy of Traditional Chinese Medicine (Master degree.) She is a diplomate certified by the National Certification Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine and licensed to practice acupuncture by the Texas Medical Board. Currently, she practices acupuncture three half-days in the Family Medicine Clinic at Texas Tech Physicians Medical Pavilion. Dr. Zhang's research has been focused on health services and integrative medicine, targeting vulnerable women, minorities, and elderly populations.

During this presentation, the audience will learn about the history of traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM); its concepts, principles, and approaches; and its current status in China. In addition, acupuncture, one of TCM's main approaches, will be introduced in detail.
