

## Texas IPE Consortium TeamSTEPPS Master Training, April 23, 2021

TeamSTEPPS Master Training Course is an interactive train-the-trainer course that prepares participants to plan, teach, implement, and sustain TeamSTEPPS fundamentals. Developed by the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality and the Department of Defense Patient Safety Program, TeamSTEPPS has rapidly become a virtual industry standard for teamwork. This course produces Master Trainers, who will be trained to go back to their respective institutions and offer TeamSTEPPS training and certification. Approximately 6 hours of online pre-work must be completed at least 10 days prior to the virtual training.

The TeamSTEPPS Master Training Course is a highly-interactive course and the content is based on a framework of four teachable-learnable core teamwork skills: Communication, Leadership, Situation Monitoring, and Mutual Support.

**TeamSTEPPS** (*Team Strategies and Tools to Enhance Performance and Patient Safety*) provides healthcare professionals with a framework for teaching teamwork and communication skills that lead to improved patient safety and quality of care.

**Demo Days** uses learned TeamSTEPPS skills and strategies, breaking them down into team building activities that enhance learning and application of key concepts. Team building activities focus on team structure, communication, leadership, situation monitoring, and mutual support. A toolkit of experiential learning activities is available to participating faculty and staff.
