SHATTER THE STIGMA


An Interprofessional Simulation with Standardized Patients

Because healthcare professionals are typically the first points of contact for a person with a **substance use disorder** (SUD), we should all take the necessary steps to reduce the potential for stigma and negative bias. Take the first step in shattering the stigma of SUDs by learning and practicing the use of destigmatizing patient interviewing techniques with standardized patients.

Substance use disorders are associated with discrimination and social disapproval - more so than any other medical condition. Many patients with Opioid Use Disorder (OUD), have a high likelihood of readmission, with the root cause of their healthcare needs unmet. Left untreated, thousands of deaths occur every year, impacting the lives of those around them as well.

Alleviating stigmas around OUD is not easy. Healthcare professionals play a critical role in providing holistic care that is compassionate to the needs of the patient and the patients' willingness to access a healthcare system that is often judgmental leading to feelings of shame and rejection.

Join Lucas Hill, PharmD, BCPS, BCACP in a keynote that addresses the importance of meeting patients where they are in an effort to reduce the harm of stigmas in healthcare today.

Following the keynote, Zach Sneed, PhD, LCDC, CRC will discuss patient interviewing strategies to destigmatizing substance use disorders.

Preventable medical errors are the third leading cause of death in the United States claiming the lives of over 400,000 patients each year. These numbers underscore the need for patient safety training and education for healthcare professionals. Interprofessional education and practice are critical to patient safety and improved patient care.

Do No Harm: An Interprofessional Patient Safety Event provides opportunities for interprofessional teams of students an opportunity to identify and resolve potential medical errors and hazards in various patient care settings, discuss root causes in medical error, and practice the disclosure of medical errors as a team.

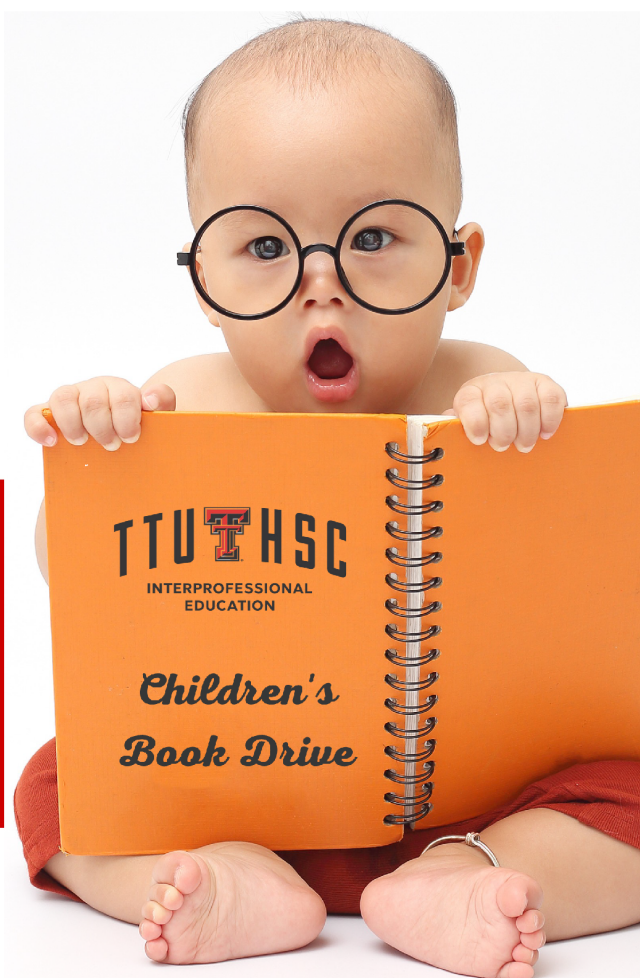

What is the Interprofessional Toy Fair & Expo

Children learn, grow, and develop by playing with toys and reading books. In the United States about 15% of children have a developmental delay and/or disability. Many of these families struggle to select and use toys that will be best for their child's development. Lubbock Early Childhood Intervention (ELI) and Texas Tech University Health Science Center (TTUHSC) students have partnered together to host the Interprofessional Toy Fair & Expo each fall for children age birth-to-3 who receive early intervention services through Lubbock ECI.

During the event, TTUHSC students educate families on the safe use of toys to promote the child's engagement and development (physical, cognitive, and social). Each child and their family goes home with a flip-book that includes all the demonstrated toys and new ways to play with the toy, an early literacy book, and a therapeutic toy appropriate for the specific child.

The Interprofessional Toy Fair & Expo is held every fall with interprofessional teams of students from audiology, nursing, occupational therapy physical therapy, and speech-language pathology. During this community service event, teams work with and educate families of children birth through age 3 on the use of toys to increase physical, cognitive, communicative, social/emotional, and self-help development. The annual event draws approximately 200 families, where participants go home with an educational toy to foster their development and a new book.
