HAVE YOU REGISTERED YOUR IPE ACTIVITY OR EVENT?

The Office of Interprofessional Education manages a curated registry of all current registered IPE activities and evnts held across TTUHSC.

The registry is a great resource for identifying IPE events or activities and can be searched by school, program, campus, or IPE competency. Detailed reports can also be printed to show accrediting bodies or administration the types and number of IPE activities within your school.

Registering an IPE activity is simple. The registry is embedded on the IPE webpage with an option to register a new activity or search the database.

When registering a new activity, simply populate the form with the appropriate information and our office will review it for any additional information that may be needed. Your registered activity will be good for one year and can be renewed annually. Certificates are available through each registered activity for participating students and faculty.

SPRING IPE DAY 2020: FIRE IN THE HEATLAND

Student registration is open for Spring IPE Day! On February 14th, the Office of Interprofessional Education will host Spring IPE Day to foster improvement in interprofessional communication and teamwork skills within a public health emergency framework with an emphasis on community resources, policy, action planning, and population health. The theme of this year's event is **Fire in the Heartland** and will feature public health outcomes and interprofessional action response planning associated with wildfires in the central plains, including West Texas. Spring IPE Day will be held simultaneously on the Abilene, Amarillo, Dallas, Lubbock, and Odessa campuses. WHAT IS TEAMSTEPPS MASTER **TRAINING?**

TeamSTEPPS Master Training is a one day learning experience (with individual pre-work prior to course participation) with a train-the-trainer approach.

Throughout the day, learners will participate in active learning of the TeamSTEPPS components through games, scenarios and discussion while gaining experience in teaching TeamSTEPPS concepts to students or staff. The course is taught by Master Trainers on our TTUHSC campuses and once trained, participants in turn can train new trainers or provide fundamentals training to faculty, staff, and students.

TeamSTEPPS Master Training is open to all faculty and staff on all campuses, both clinical and nonclinical alike. There is no fee for TTUHSC employees.

TeamSTEPPS training objectives are to:

- * Identify common communication and teamwork related challenges in health care
- Learn the TeamSTEPPS tools and how they can help to overcome communication and teamwork related challenges
- Analyze how the TeamSTEPPS tools can be effectively implemented in the health care settina
- Practice the use of the TeamSTEPPS tools in practical scenarios and simulations
- Construct a plan to teach, coach, measure, and implement the TeamSTEPPS tools



Team Training Demo Days is a hands-on, interactive opportunity to learn through gaming ways to incorporate various team building activities into your school curriculum, staff training, or other numerous events and activities.

Demo Days are offered twice each fall and spring semester and are open to all faculty and staff to attend. During the one hour training, 2-3 new activities will be showcased and attendees will work together in interprofessional teams to achieve the desired outcome. A debrief is held following each activity to discuss communication and teamwork skills used as well as various leadership strategies that were incorporated.

Activities demonstrated can be used in a variety of applications to include TeamSTEPPS training.

Team building activities are held in a repository Box file and can be accessed by attendees who wish to incorporate them into their curriculum or other settings.

The Office of Interprofessional Education has available for check-out materials for each activity that are free to all schools (quantities will vary).

Goal: Reassemble the crash victims Rules:

- Select a surgery team to reassemble the victims. Team cannot view the photo of the victims.
- Select a triage officer that knows what the victims looked like before the accident. Cannot change once assigned. Triage officer cannot view rescue efforts.
- Select relay person to communicate between the surgery team and the triage officer.
- Final assembly must precisely reflect the original photo.
- 15 minute time limit.
