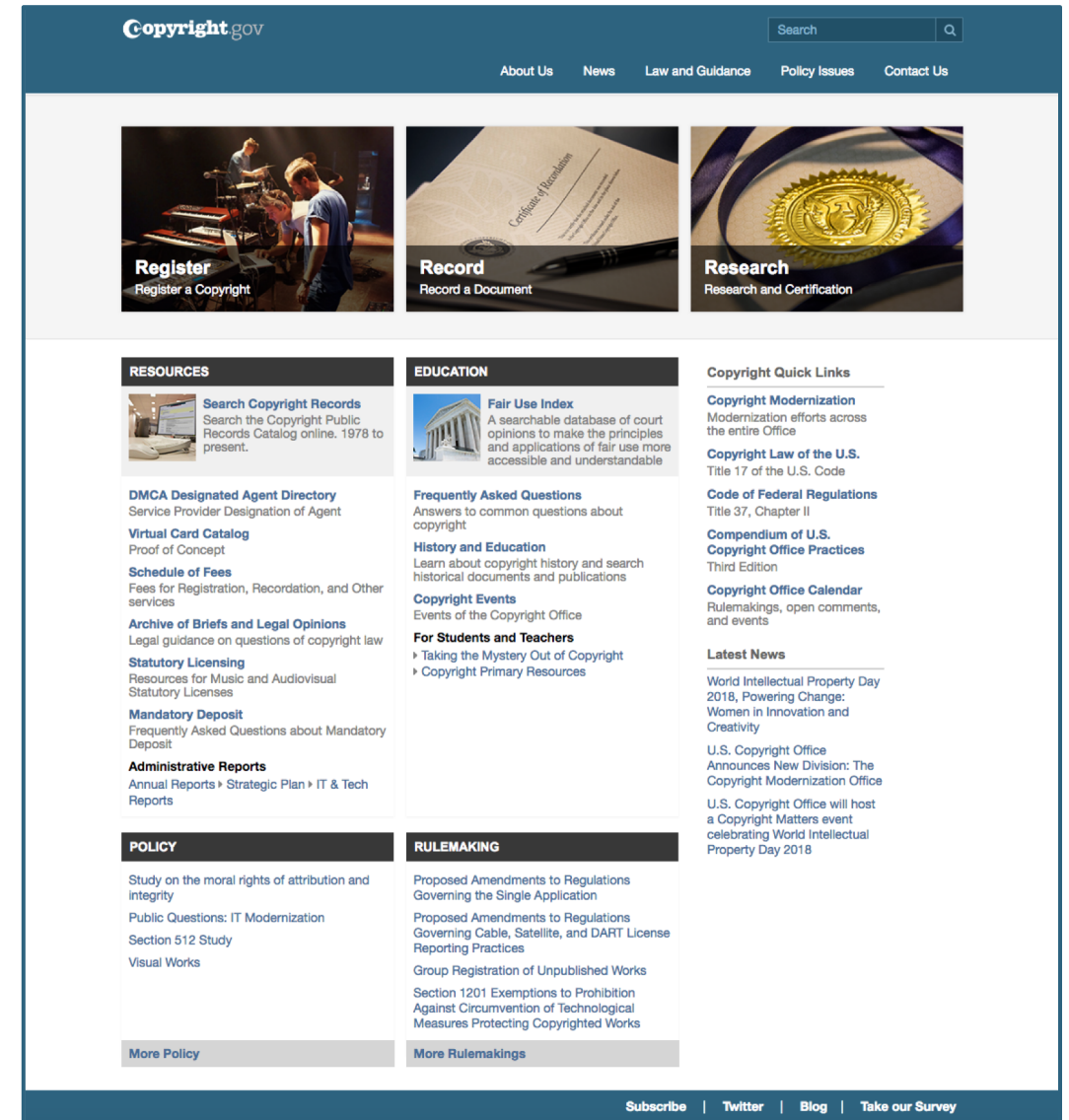

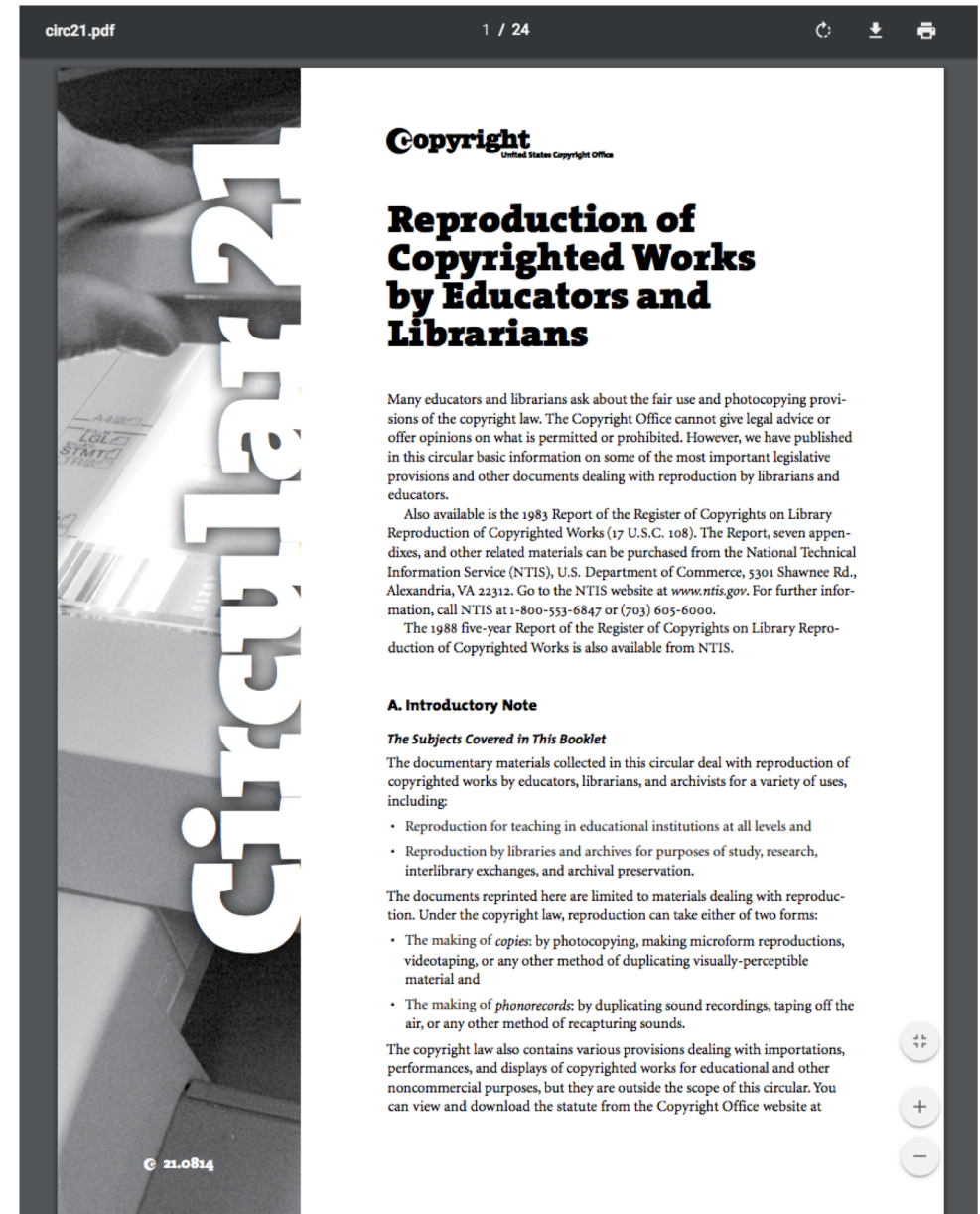
Mozilla Firefox, Safari, or Internet Explorer often do not work with library applications or *open journal articles*!
