With its headquarters nestled in the heart of the South Plains, Texas Tech Health Sciences Center is a dynamic and flourishing institution with positive impact throughout the state and Southwest.

The School of Medicine was created by the 61st Texas Legislature in May 1969 as a multi-campus institution to serve 108 West Texas counties — an area encompassing approximately 135,000 square miles. Regional Academic Health Centers in Amarillo, El Paso, Lubbock and Odessa serve as bases for education and service programs across the region.

Mandates for the school are to provide quality medical education, to address problems of health care delivery in rural areas and to develop programs throughout West Texas with an emphasis on primary health care.





AMARILLO



The first two years at Texas Tech School of Medicine is devoted to the study of the Basic Sciences. Upon completion of these two years, each class of 100 students is divided into 3 groups — assigned to each of the 3 campuses.

The Texas Tech Regional Academic Health Center at Amarillo serves as one of the bases for clinical education for third and fourth year medical students. The original 37,800 square foot facility for the RAHC was dedicated in April 1976. The second phase of the facility has been completed, adding an additional 37,800 square feet.

Clinical experiences are provided through affiliations with Northwest Texas Hospital (the primary teaching hospital), and the Psychiatric Pavilion, High Plains Baptist Hospital, St. Anthony's Hospital, Veterans Administration Medical Center, Killgore Children's Psychiatric Center and Hospital, the Don and Sybil Harrington Cancer Center and the Bi-County Health Department.

The center also is a base for coordination of rural and urban preceptorships in clinics and private practices throughout the Panhandle region.

The Regional Academic Health Center in El Paso was dedicated in 1977. Third and fourth year medical students based in El Paso participate in the required clinical clerkships in Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Orthopaedic Surgery, Pediatrics, Psychiatry and Surgery. The resident physician programs in El Paso are essential to the training of third year medical students in that center.

The center provides clinical experiences through affiliations with R.E. Thomason General Hospital, the primary teaching hospital, augmented through affiliations with William Beaumont U.S. Army Medical Center and other community hospitals and facilities.

























