








Medical Students


And yet, somehow,

you too. Usually celebrated with a party, you may now begin to formulate answers to the questions, "How am I going to get all my stuff that far?"



Nursing

The Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center School of Nursing offers a four year Bachelor of Science's degree in nursing. This program is unique among nursing programs because students are involved in clinical practice beginning with their first year in the school.

In this program, there is an integration of nursing courses and general educational courses, which are usually completed at Texas Tech University.

Experience in nursing is achieved in a variety of clinical

settings, including hospitals, community agencies, clinics and the homes of individual families.

The first year of the program emphasizes basic nursing skills and human development through the life span. The second year includes psychiatric, obstetrical and gynecological nursing. The third year focuses on validation of nursing skills and decision making. Finally, the fourth year emphasizes community health, collaboration and management.

In addition to the Lubbock campus, there is a campus at the

Permian Basin in Odessa. This program allows R.N.'s from diploma and associate degree programs to complete a B.S.N. That campus will graduate its first class in May, 1987.

The Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center School of Nursing is committed to excellence in nursing and focuses on increasing both the quality and quantity of nursing care in West Texas. Occupational Therapy

Occupational Therapy is a vital health care profession that uses purposeful activity as the basis for treatment of individuals of all ages who have physical, developmental, emotional and social deficits. The key to this profession is treating the individual as a whole person. This concept is reinforced throughout the professional curriculum.














Medical Technology

Medical technology combines the skills of chemistry, blood banking, hematology, immunoser-ology, urinalysis and microbiology to provide a background of information necessary for the diagnosis of patients. The medical technologist is educated to handle any difficult or emergency situation which arises in the laboratory.

Two years of a science-

based curriculum must be completed at an accredited university prior to entrance into the school of medical technology. The final two years consists of expert instruction which includes class work and internship in each of the specified areas.
