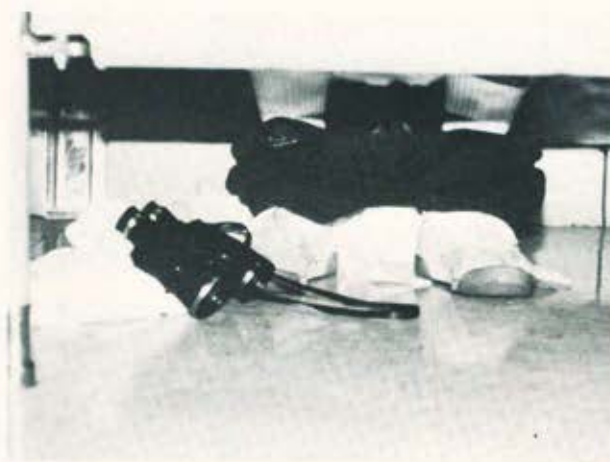

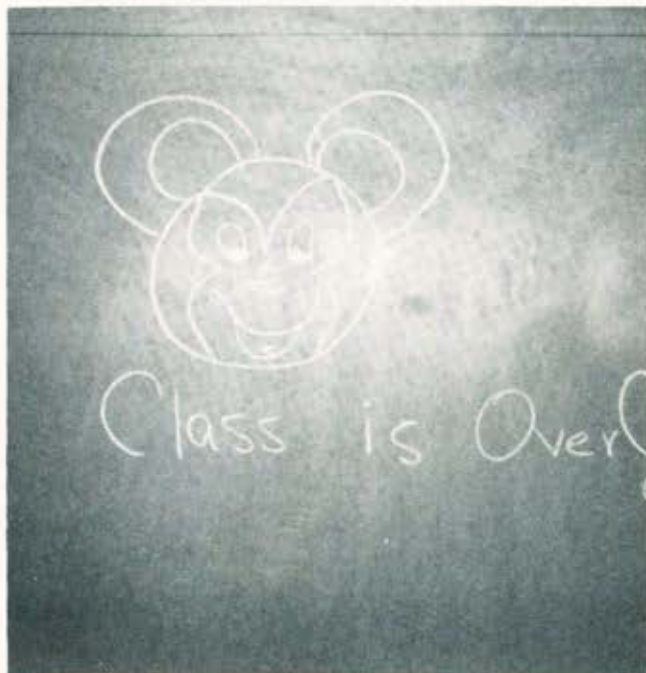

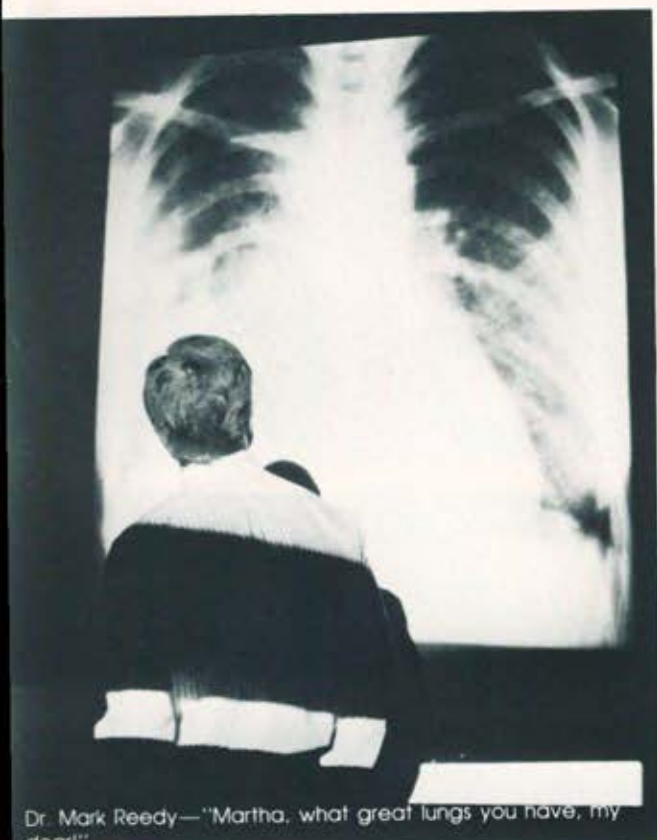
Probably the most positive aspect of the second year is developing and expanding the friendships that were begun last year. Classmates become more than just friends; they become colleagues to be respected.

M. S. IV

The fourth year of medical school is an experience. With third year rotations behind you, you are handed a piece of paper on which to designate what electives you desire to study, in four-week sections, during your fourth year. When it has been thoroughly explained that one cannot take four months of vacation in addition to two months of "Radi-holiday," you end up with any variety of electives in various places around the globe. The senior year has two required rotation months, one as a Family Medicine clerkship and one as a Family Medicine Preceptorship.

A lot of fourth year students take the month of July as vacation. Possibly, this practice should be mandatory. During that month, some people actually take vacations, but an

equal number catch up on sleep and reacquaint themselves with their families. This is also the month in which paperwork for residency application begins in earnest. Long about November, most students take another month off to interview for residencies. *Deja vu!* The whole experience is entirely too reminiscent of interviewing for medical school.

Then one fateful day in January, you make the decision that seals your fate, the list that you sent to the matching program. Now all that is left is to sit back and not foul up the remaining rotations ... and wait for Match Day. Match Day comes once in a lifetime around the middle of March in your fourth year of med school. This is when you find out if the programs that you liked, liked

you too. Usually celebrated with a party, you may now begin to formulate answers to the questions, "How am I going to get all my stuff that far?"

Then Graduation Day arrives, sooner than you would have believed. Now you are referred to as "Doctor," and the word doesn't have the quotation marks around it, and the profound responsibility begins to have real meaning. The Texas Tech School of Medicine Graduating Class of 1987 will go to 59 different graduate programs, to all corners of the country, in 19 different specialties. We trust that each and every one will excel in their chosen field, reflecting the good educational foundation built.

The Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center School of Nursing offers a four year Bachelor of Science's degree in nursing. This program is unique among nursing programs because students are involved in clinical practice beginning with their *first* year in the school.

In this program, there is an integration of nursing courses and general educational courses, which are usually completed at Texas Tech University.

Experience in nursing is achieved in a variety of clinical

settings, including hospitals, community agencies, clinics and the homes of individual families.

The first year of the program emphasizes basic nursing skills and human development through the life span. The second year includes psychiatric, obstetrical and gynecological nursing. The third year focuses on validation of nursing skills and decision making. Finally, the fourth year emphasizes community health, collaboration and management.

In addition to the Lubbock campus, there is a campus at the

Permian Basin in Odessa. This program allows R.N.'s from diploma and associate degree programs to complete a B.S.N. That campus will graduate its first class in May, 1987.

The Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center School of Nursing is committed to excellence in nursing and focuses on increasing both the quality and quantity of nursing care in West Texas. As students in the TTUHSC School of Nursing, we feel that nursing really is the *CAREER* that begins with *CARE*.

Occupational Therapy

Occupational Therapy is a vital health care profession that uses purposeful activity as the basis for treatment of individuals of all ages who have physical, developmental, emotional and social deficits. 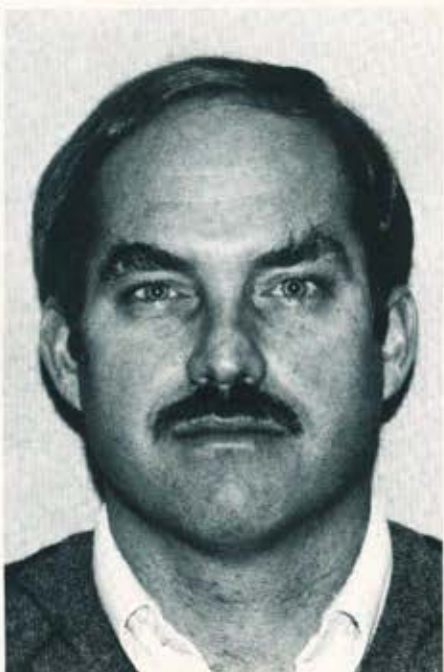

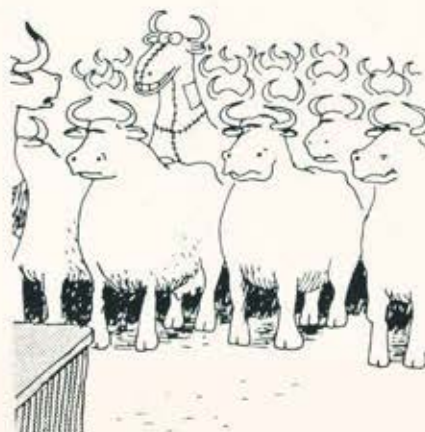

Medical Technology

Medical Technology: Striving for excellence in the laboratory.

Medical technology combines the skills of chemistry, blood banking, hematology, immunoserology, urinalysis and microbiology to provide a background of information necessary for the diagnosis of patients. The medical technologist is educated to handle any difficult or emergency situation which arises in the laboratory.

Two years of a science-

based curriculum must be completed at an accredited university prior to entrance into the school of medical technology. The final two years consists of expert instruction which includes class work and internship in each of the specified areas. Internship at several community hospitals provides a wide range of working conditions, enabling each student to be more at home in any laboratory environment. The *hands on* learning acquired

through the internship process creates a new and unique method of education. Medical technology is a growing profession which is vital to the achievement and maintenance of excellence in health care.

Medical technology students also manage to let their hair down once in a while. Parties are in order for almost any occasion and students become quite close, given the small size of the overall program and the close

proximity of working conditions. In April, the Texas Society of Medical Technologists met in Houston to share ideas, techniques and knowledge. Tech's Techs were in attendance and the proverbial *good time* was had by all. Still, the tie that binds is a commitment to the community at large to provide quality health care and to administer to the needs of those who call upon our services.
