From The Very Beginning

The School of Medicine was created by the 61st Texas legislature in May, 1969 as a multi-campus institution serving 108 West Texas counties. Regional Academic Health Centers were also created in Amarillo, El Paso, Lubbock, and Odessa. Originally located in Thompson Hall, The School of Medicine and Nursing moved into the new Health Sciences Center after its construction. The School of Allied Health and Nursing were officially approved for funding by the 67th legislature in 1981, allowing all three schools to come together under one roof.



PT School Promotes Comradeship Among Students



Striving For Excellence



Getting Into The Community


