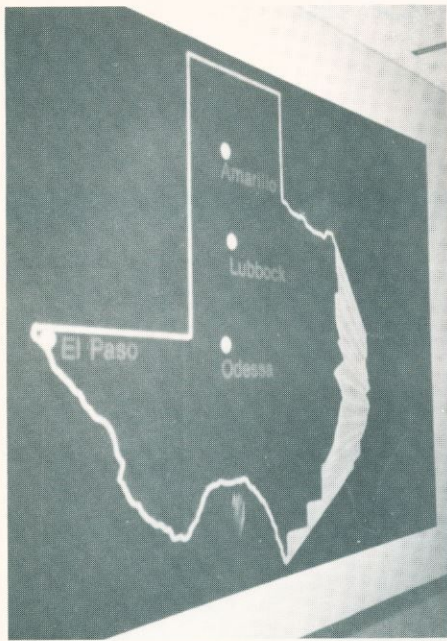

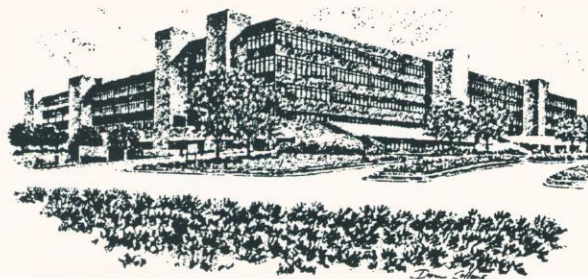

## GERMANY UNIFIED !

After more than twenty years of separation by the Berlin Wall, East and West Germany became a single country once again on October 3, 1990. After months of internal unrest and massive emigration, the people of East Germany rejected their government, and demanded reunification. The day before official unification, Britain, France the U. S and the U.S.S.R. withdrew their rights to the city of Berlin. The dismantling of the Berlin Wall, often by hand, was a physical symbol of the beginning of the end of the Warsaw Pact. The first few months of joyous reunion were quickly overshadowed by the realities of meshing the two German economies and cultures.

## COMMUNISM FALLS

Beginning with the dramatic demand for independence by first Lithuania then other Warsaw Pact members, the president of the U.S.S.R., Mikhail Gorbachev faced many threats to his leadership of the "Communist World". Regardless of his attempts at reform, including perestroika and glasnost, the failure of his economic policies lead to widespread unrest. The first free elections in the Soviet Union placed Boris Yeltsin in the position of Chairman of the Supreme Soviet of the Russian Federation. Yeltsin's call for the independence of several Russian states as well as Baltic countries is perhaps the most severe threat to Gorbachev's power. How Gorbachev chooses to deal with these threats will determine whether the result is democracy for independent states, a dictatorship or outright civil war.

## THE IRON LADY RESIGNS

Margaret Thatcher, staunch supporter of Ronald Reagan throughout his term, resigned after eleven years as Prime Minister of England.

## "RE -READ MY LIPS"

While President Bush was elected on the promise of "no new taxes" the nation was faced with new taxes in 1990. These "enhanced revenues" were a response to a mounting budget crisis and the threat of automatic spending cuts mandated by the Graham-Rudman Act.

## SOUTER TO SUPREME COURT

David Souter, relatively unknown, was appointed to the U. S. Supreme Court. Conservatives and Liberals alike wait to see whether he will tip the balance of the court one way or the other.

## ANN RICHARDS ELECTED GOVERNOR OF TEXAS

Demoncrat Ann Richards clobbered Republican Clayton Williams in a controversial gubernatorial race. Williams' insensitive jokes and comments destroyed a significant G.O.P. lead in the polls. Williams sealed his fate with an eleventh hour confession...he didn't know what was on the ballot much beyond his own name. He was, he confessed, relying on his wife's advice.

## "FUTBOL" HERE, FOOTBALL THERE

While in the U.S. football reigns supreme, soccer is the most popular sport in the rest of the world. For the first time ever, the World Cup will be held in the U.S. At the same time, American professional football has been increasingly exported around the world, to such countries as England, Germany, Spain and Japan.

## IRAQ INVADES KUWAIT WAR BREAKS OUT!

One event that truly sets this academic year apart from others is the Gulf War. This war began and ended within the academic year.

There was much apprehension among the American public that this war might become long and drawn out like the Vietnam War. Many demonstrations took place throughout the nation, both in protest and in support of the war. The overwhelming majority of the nation supported President Bush in his firm stand, and Lubbock was no exception. West Texas, like the rest of the world watched the high tech war via high tech media communications. For some, the war was even closer, involving freinds and loved ones.

There were many tense moments during the relatively short period of declared war. Even after the fighting between the Allied Forces had stopped, there was conflict between various factions within Iraq. Refugees were attacked by their own countrymen. Human suffering has indeed been great. As future health professionals we are that much more saddened by suffering of any kind.

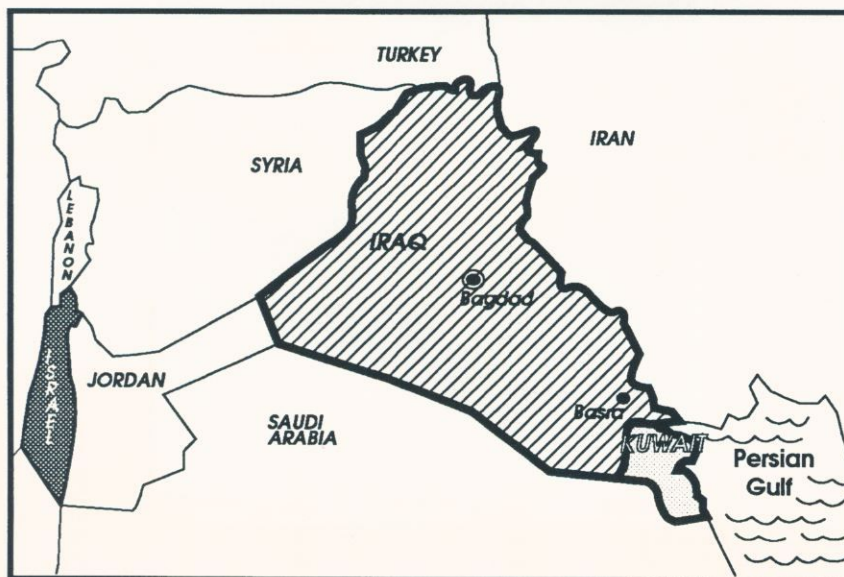
On August 2, 1990 Iraq invaded Kuwait. The world responded immediately and vigorously throughout the month of August with economic sanctions and a denouncement of Saddam Hussain's actions by the United Nations. The U.S. navy enforced a blockade, and a massive U.S. military build up began in neighboring Saudi Arabia.

In September, the U.S. and Soviet Union became allied against Iraq.

In November, a deadline of January 15 for the removal of all Iraqi troops from Kuwait was set by the U.N.

In December, the outlook for compromise looked quite grim. Saddam Hussain refused to talk and threatened the use of chemical weapons.

Congress formally backed President Bush on January 12. On January 16 war began with an air assault on Bagdad. The ground phase was delayed and lasted only 100

The Student Lounge, on the other hand, has a kind of retro-Fifties feel complete with pool tables, foosball, and a pretty amazing wide-screen TV.

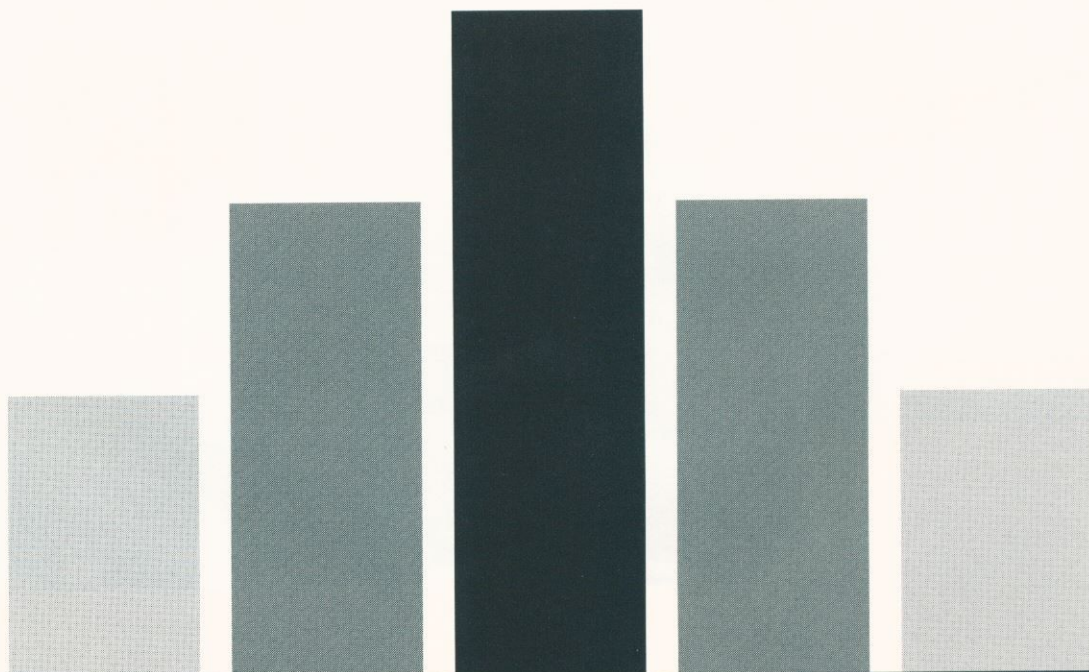

# Letters From Home

Throughout the Persian Gulf Crisis not only was Lubbock covered with yellow ribbon, but also people wrote to their friends and family stationed far away. An electronic mail service was based in the HSC library.

## INSTRUCTIONS IF YOU WORDPROCESS YOUR LETTER

*Read and follow all instructions.*

The Library of the Health Sciences and GE Information Services is pleased to provide "Letters from Home" - a program to allow Soldiers and friends of loved ones serving with the U.S. Armed Forces in the Persian Gulf region to send FREE electronic mail messages via the Global Online Information Service.

The following information is necessary in order to send a message (maximum of 40 lines, 80 characters per line):



Name & Rank  
Social Security Number  
Dut or Ship Name  
APO or FPO Number



If you are unable to supply any of the above information, the system will not allow you to enter a letter.

### OFFLINE LETTER ENTRY

To save time, you can create your letter offline, using a word processor you are familiar with, and then uploading the text into the Letters from Home system.

You must:

- not use proportionally spaced fonts when you create your letter
- be sure to type a space before each carriage return
- be sure to type a space and a return on any line you want to be blank
- save the file as text only
- not use any special features e.g. italics, bold etc.

Once you have created your letter and saved it, log on to the Letters from Home system by using instructions available at the Library - TLC.

1. When you receive the first line number prompt, type \*Up and press Enter.
2. After prompt Ready for input press ppup key.
3. Choose 7 and name your file giving drive and filename. For example if you have 5 1/4 in. disk then you would input: a filename, for 3 1/2 in. input b:filename.
4. To view your letter press Alt and v and enter your filename as before.
5. Press Ctrl and "O" simultaneously.
6. To send your letter type \*S at the line prompt.
7. Press Alt and x to exit to dos.

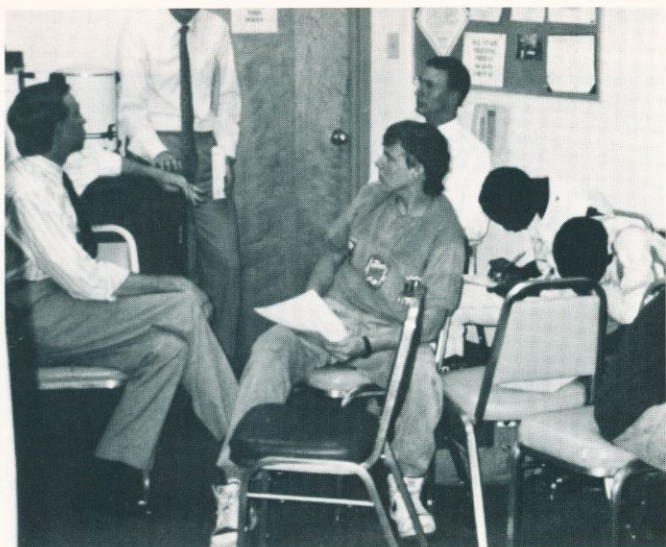

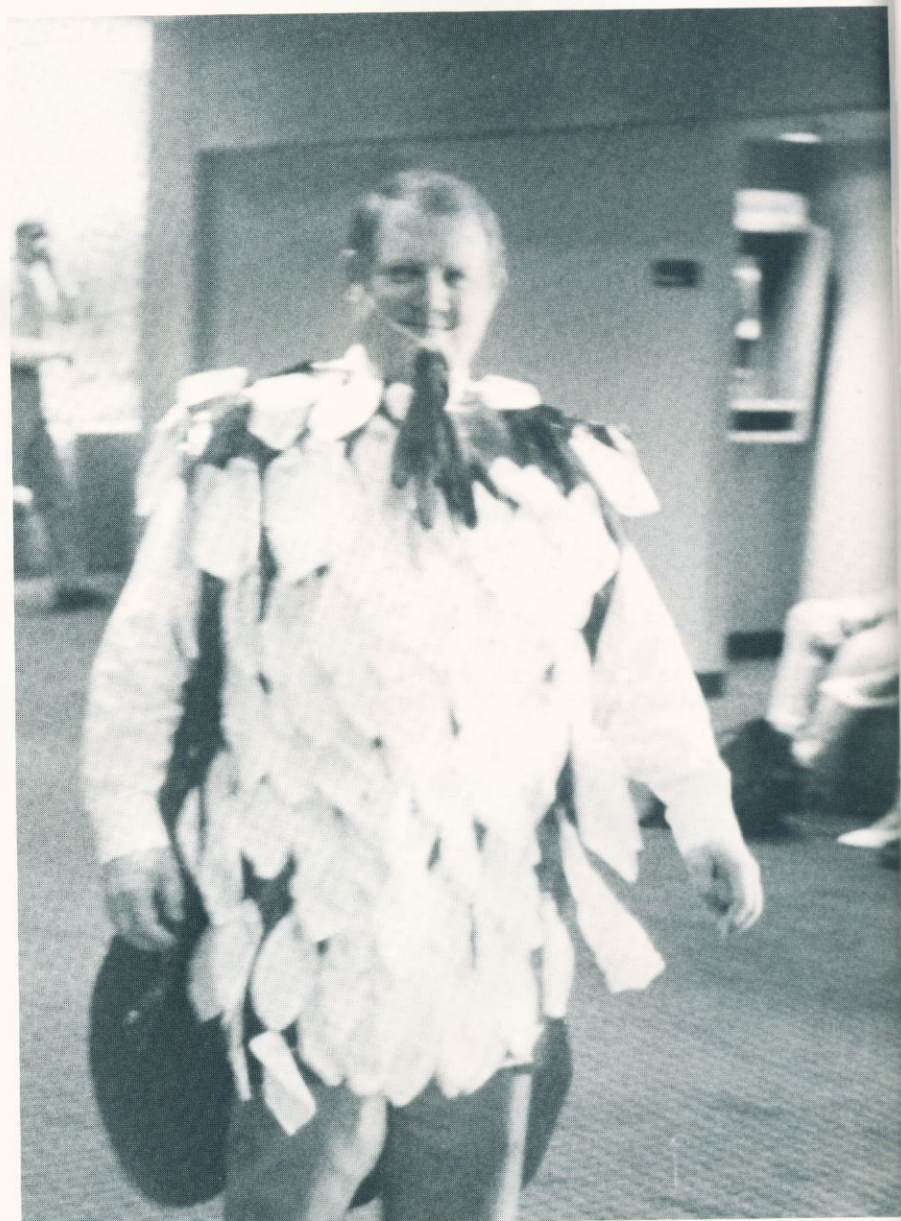

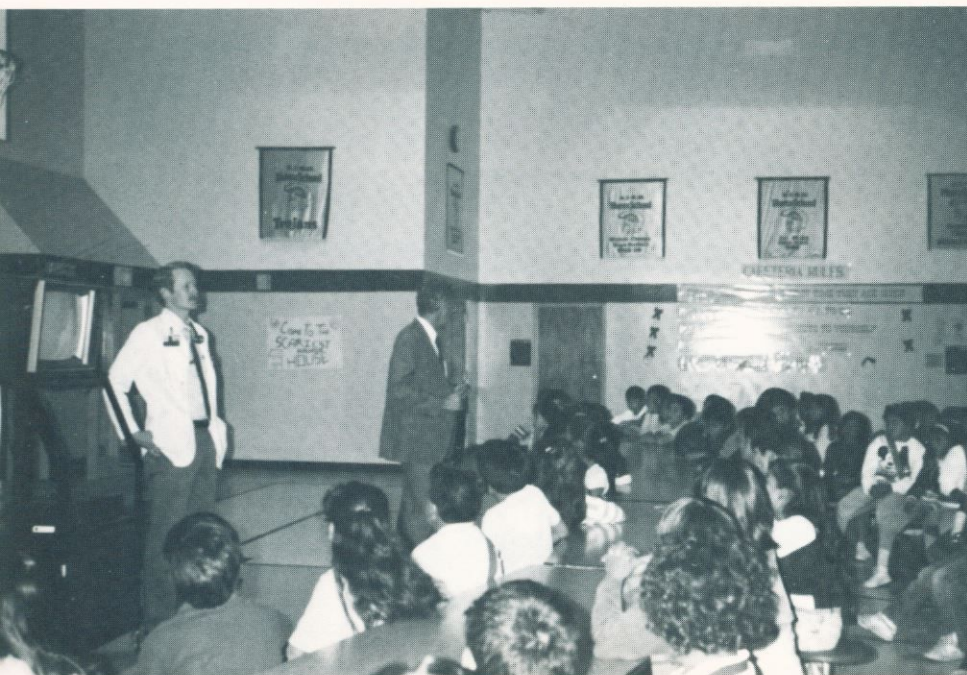

## Introduction To Clinical Skills

Performing a medical procedure for the first time may be a bit uncomfortable for both the patient and student doctor. To reduce this uneasiness, the Family Practice Student Association conducted a workshop in April of 1991 to introduce second year medical students to some often used medical skills. The workshop was led by Dr. Richard Homan, a member of the TTUHSC Department of Family Medicine and the recently appointed faculty advisor to the FPSA.

The workshop consisted of several stations, each staffed by faculty and residents from the Department of Family Medicine. Topics covered included IV/Venipuncture, lumbar puncture, EKG basics, suturing and sage advice on the ins and outs of doing well on a clerkship rotation. The use of real equipment and life-like models allowed students to gain true "hands-on" experience with the supervision of an experienced family physician.

An informal poll of the forty-five students who attended indicated that it was a great success. There is a possibility that some of the skills will be integrated into the second year Intro to Patient Assessment class. Whatever the future forum may be, the favorable response of both faculty and students indicate that the skills clinic will likely be an annual event for TTUHSC and the Department of Family Medicine.

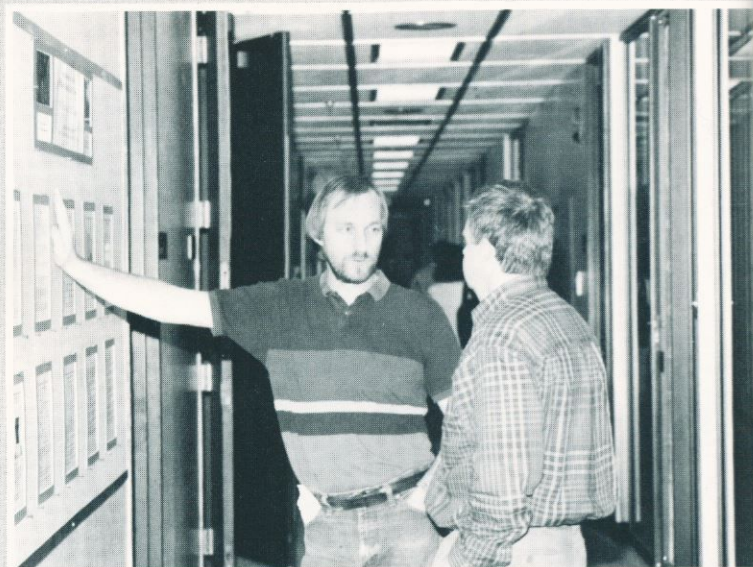

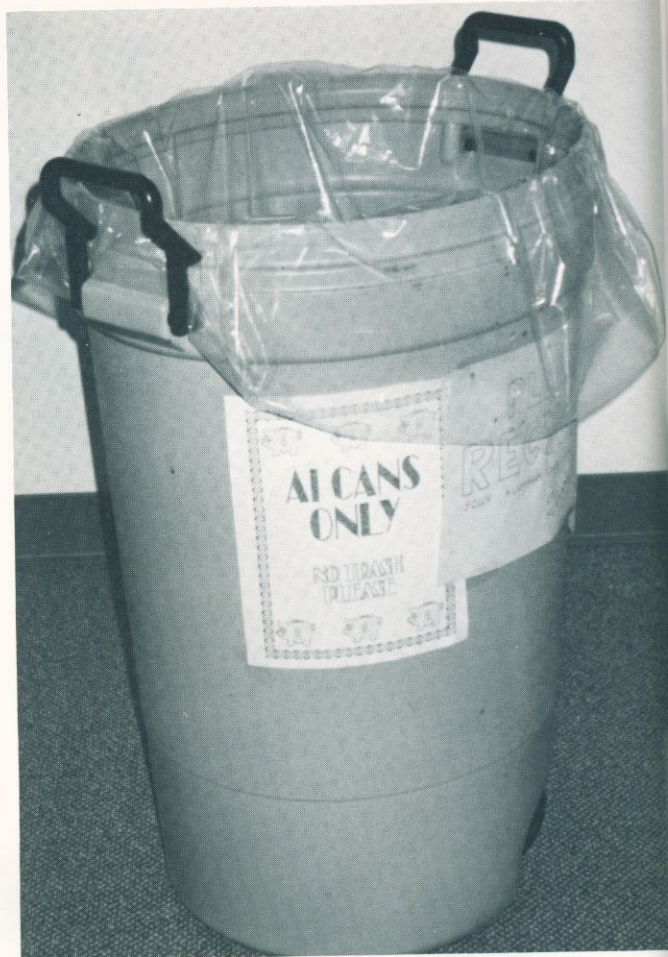




# MS-Is Recycle
