

Film offers an important window into what we mean by illness and health, who makes the rules, and how the human spirit can adapt to illness. This film series will examine themes of dying and compassion, resilience and the influence of culture. We will be giving particular attention to the image of the patient as subject and object in the doctor/patient encounter and how American society shapes that relationship. Students will be introduced to the thematic plot devices and historical and cultural background of the film. Students will participate in a discussion of the film and explore what it means to be a patient. Light dinner will be served to the first 30 students to sign up. Attend 6 films for credit.
