

SCHOOL OF PHARMACY PHARM.D-MBA REVIEW COMMITTEE

Each applicant for the Pharm.D-MBA program must complete the requirements for both the School of Pharmacy as well as the College of Business. Each program controls their admissions policies, admissions procedures, interviews and enrollment. Each applicant must meet the requirement of the School of Pharmacy to be considered a potential applicant for the Pharm.D-MBA program.

P0-P1 and rising P2 students will be advised by email to apply to the College of Business. If the School of Pharmacy Review Committee does not recommend an applicant to the Dean, the MBA program will not honor the application of that person. Applicants who are recommended to the MBA program should follow the 3-step process listed under the link entitled "Admission Information for the Pharm.D-MBA Dual Degree Program".

The School of Pharmacy will form a Review Committee consisting of faculty in the administrative sciences and members of student services. Any information available to the Committee can be considered. The Committee will be interested in previous grades, especially in any business or social sciences courses; extracurricular activities, PCAT scores, and documentation of a BS, BA or BBA degree.

Each applicant is evaluated and placed in one of three categories: recommend; wait-list, or not recommend. A list of recommended candidates is submitted to the Dean, School of Pharmacy. The Dean will submit a recommendation letter to the Graduate Admissions Committee of the Rawls College of Business.

If an applicant is recommended to the Graduate Admissions Committee, student services will send PCAT scores and letters of reference used for pharmacy school. The GMAT and separate letters of recommendation for Graduate Admissions are not required.
