Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center School of Pharmacy High Risk Drug Knowledge Assessment (HRDKA) Exam INFORMATION

High Risk Drug Knowledge Assessment (HRDKA) is a minimal competency exam. The objective of this assessment is to evaluate student basic knowledge of Top 200 Drugs utilized in their practice. Successfully passing of this exam is required for students to progress into the Advanced Pharmacy Practice Experiences (APPE) of the P4 curriculum.

HRDKA exam is administered annually in the month of January. It is conducted at all of our four campuses at the same time with the assistance from Regional Dean and members of Student Assessment of Learning (SAL) committee. The exam is multiple choice with 4 possible answer options. The questions in the exam are derived from top 200 drugs utilized in the hospital (in-patient) and out-patient settings. The exam evaluates student drug knowledge in the following areas:

- (1) Drug Name (Brand/Generic)
- (2) Mechanism of Action
- (3) Drug Kinetics or interactions
- (4) Dosing
- (5) Indication
- (6) Adverse effects/monitoring parameters
- (7) Contraindications

The HRDKA exam is a required exam for all registered P3 students. The exam is evaluated and results are communicated to students prior to their enrollment in to P4 curriculum. Score of 75% is required to pass the HRDKA exam. The SAL committee is responsible for making recommendation to the Executive Committee and Dean for student(s) who fail the exam.

Student can request a review of his or her test up to 2 weeks from the release of HRDKA exam score. Thereafter test review will not be provided.
