The U.S. Public Health Service Commissioned Corps protects, promotes, and advances the health and safety of the Nation. With more than 6,800 officers, the Commissioned Corps is one of the seven uniformed services of the United States and is part of the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). As the world's foremost uniformed public health service, the Corps is composed entirely of officers who have been commissioned on the basis of their health-related training. JRCOSTEP participants do not have an obligation to serve in the Commissioned Corps after graduation. Students hold the rank of Ensign (01) during the program. The program is currently taking applications for students enrolled full time in an accredited program in the following areas of study: Medical Laboratory Scientist, Nurse, Nurse Practitioner (if already possess a BSN then not eligible for program), Pharmacy, Physical Therapist and Physician Assistant. SRCOSTEPs hold the rank of Ensign (01) during the program.
