

- Pre-plan your days

 - What happens at Midyear does not stay at Midyear


Travel

- Hotel
 - Recommended to book hotels through ASHP
 - Do not have to use ASHP hotels
- Airlines
 - SNA airport code (13 miles)
 - Also ONT or LAX (35 miles)
 - Up to 5% discount if purchased through ATC
 - Service fee
- Ground
 - Use taxis or airport shuttles
 - Super shuttle discount online (code: ASHSP)

- Staffed by program director, preceptors, current residents
- Most will have handouts or recruitment materials
- P1 P3 students are asked to wait until the later half of each session to attend


Residency Showcase

• Advice:

- Business attire
- Do your homework on programs
- Get in there and talk!
 - Talk with program directors and preceptors
 - Talk to current residents
 - Be respectful try to limit to 10-15 minutes
- Ask lots of questions
 - Avoid the obvious
- Bring 15-20 CVs and/or business cards
- Take notes to help keep everything straight
 - Especially names of people you met with
- Can ask to speak outside of the showcase
- Send thank you notes

CareerPharm's Personnel Placement Service (PPS)

- Separate from the Residency Showcase
 - Must be registered
- Sunday to Wednesday (7:30 am to 5 pm)
 - Can check online beginning October 25
 - Usually tapers off by Tuesday
- Formal 30 minute interviews
 - Contact and set up ahead of time or on-site
 - Sign up list at the program table/booth
- Bring 20-30 copies of your CV
- Good idea to acknowledge all contacts

Helpful Hints

- Standard 8 ½ X 11 inch bond paper
 - Make sure watermark is right side up
- Single side printing
- Conservative, 11-14 size font throughout
- Avoid excessive lines, graphics, shading, etc.
- Spelling or grammatical errors
 - Proof, proof, proof then proof again!!
 - Have numerous people review
 - Peers, faculty members, preceptors
- Avoid abbreviations
 - Explain if used

Questions NOT to ask

- Where are you located?
- Do I have to staff?
- How much do I get paid?
- What GPA do I need?

• Tell me about your program.

- What are the core and elective rotations?
- What resident activities are required ?
- What unique qualities distinguish your program?
- Do you expect any changes to the program in the next year?
- What opportunities do you provide for weekend staffing assignments?

- What are the previous residents doing?
- What are they looking for in an ideal resident?
- What benefits do the residents bring to the program? or What will participation in the program do for me?
- Do pharmacy students rotate with residents?
- What are the goals of the residency program (be sure you have looked these up, but verify and elaborate on them in the interview)?

- What is the expected preceptor oversight? (They may ask you how much you expect.)
- Am I able to tailor the program via electives, presentations, teaching, and _____ to my future goals?
 - How flexible is the program?
 - Can I change the schedule in the middle of the year if I change my goals?
- What is the interaction with the other healthcare providers, including the physicians and nursing staff?

- What are the current and residency projects?
 <u>— Have they been published?</u>
- What type of mentoring is available for the research project?
- Are their teaching opportunities?
- What is the evaluation process for the residency program?

Questions to Ask Residents

- Would you do this residency again? ***
- What do you like or dislike about the program?
 - For dislikes, how would they change it or what suggestions do they have to improve it?
- How do the current residents get along?
- What is the interaction with the RPD? With the Preceptors?

Questions to Ask Residents

- Do you feel you have received the experience you wanted and the guidance you needed?
- How much free time do you have?
 What is there to do in XYZ city?
- Safety of the area (if a concern to you)?
- Is the program well-balanced?
