The commentary relates to the opportunity for the alumni survey to be strengthened. Specifically, the program should consider adding questions that gauge skills in which the alumni felt most prepared and skills in which alumni would have benefitted from additional training. While the program's existing survey incidentally elicited some of this information, the survey does not explicitly ask about these elements, which are required by the criterion.

We will ensure that the next version of our biennial alumni survey, scheduled for Spring 2025, will more explicitly ask about these elements.
