New 15-Month Online MPH

The Department of Public Health is happy to announce that beginning in summer 2018, it will offer an accelerated online MPH option. The 45-hour degree will start in summer term, continue through fall and spring, and conclude at the end of the following summer. The degree is aimed at attracting students who wish to take off one year between a Spring undergraduate graduation and a fall graduate program the following year. All requirements of the MPH will be fulfilled as before.

- TTUHSC Student Services approved the new Student Public Health Association chapter


Faculty Activities & Honors



Project Spotlight—Danna Wolfe's ILE

Danna Wolfe completed her Integrated Learning Experience with Camp Able in Buffalo Gap, TX, a P.A.T.H. certified equine therapy and horse rescue ranch. Approximately 6,000 children in the Big Country have a disability which can be served by Camp Able's equine therapy programs. Photovoice, or digital stories, gives children a vehicle to communicate via photography. Danna's ILE focused on having the children at Camp Able create their own digital stories by using a Participatory Visual Methods approach. Her qualitative data analysis involved giving each child an

easy to use digital camera with the simple direction to take pictures of: "what makes you happy when you are at Camp Able." The children later described the contents of their photos. Danna created a three-minute marketing video which Camp Able will use to raise awareness of the benefits of equine therapy.
