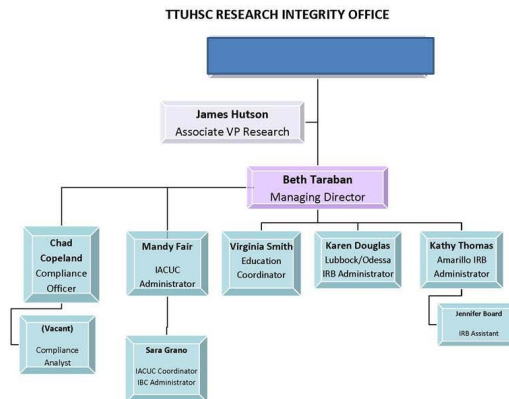

You are invited to participate in the Faculty Development Course Ultrasound in Medical Education - Train the Professor. The tentative syllabus is attached.

Ultrasound imaging is a rapidly changing field, with ongoing development of new technologies for diagnostics and treatment of medical conditions. This two-day course is designed to equip faculty educators to teach using ultrasound devices. Following the activity, the participant should be able to:

- Discuss basic physics of ultrasound
- Identify what the current technology is capable of
- Operate and demonstrate portable and hand-held ultrasound devices
- Identify structures of the normal anatomy of various organ systems
- Discuss normal physiology of various organ systems
- Teach students how to use the technology in promoting learning activity
- Teach students how to apply the technology into clinical management
- Evaluate student performance on hands-on scanning and incorporation of information to clinical management

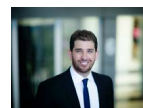
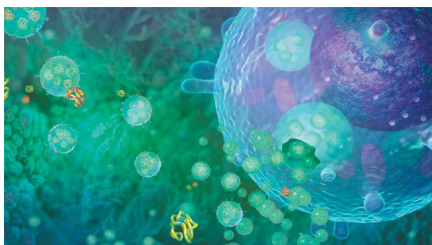



<h2>Healthcare Education Scholarship program</h2>	<p>Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center has developed a new concept for institution-wide faculty development. It's called <i>Aspire!</i> This name was selected because it connotes a positive and forward movement toward a desired destination. <i>Aspire!</i> will be directed toward those who aspire to be innovative...who aspire to be exceptional...and who desire to BE at TTUHSC.</p> <p>A new TTUHSC faculty-development initiative is the Healthcare Education Scholarship program. The majority of faculty in health professions' education lacks formal training in education or education management. Yet, the current climate of a rapidly changing educational environment along with the requirements to meet continually evolving accreditation standards requires formally trained educational leaders.
