

Leadership Update

October 9th, 2020

This week, we have witnessed a concerning trend in cases of COVID-19 within our TTUHSC team. The number of our team members in isolation has risen by 67% and the number of positive employees has risen by almost 25%. These are the highest rates since the onset of the pandemic. In addition to these staff cases, we currently have 22 active symptomatic offender cases in our sector. We need every TTUHSC team member to hold themselves and others accountable to abiding by the following [COVID-19 safety precautions](#):

- Wash your hands frequently with soap and water
- Wear a face covering
- Cover coughs and sneezes
- Avoid touching your face
- Disinfect often touched surfaces
- Stay 6 feet apart
- **Team members should not congregate for meals or breaks**
