## **IT Resource for Common Issues**

We'd like to ensure all team members are aware of a valuable IT tool called the <u>SolveIT Knowledge Portal</u>. This portal contains instructions for users to resolve common issues. Some examples include:

- How to set up and use Remote Desktop, Box, and the VPN
- How to reset a forgotten or expired eRaider password
- How to set up your TTUHSC email on a personal device

## **COVID Reminders**

On October 1, the Roach Unit will open for limited offender visitation in accordance with the <u>TDCJ COVID-19</u> <u>Visitation Plan</u>. Additional units will be considered for visitation starting on October 15. Additionally, as of today we have 9 units in Phase II of the Clinic Ramp-Up Plan. Phase II sites are able to schedule up to 50% of typical capacity. These advances are possible due to our success slowing the spread of COVID-19 in our units. However, increased movement comes with an increased responsibility to abide by established safety precautions and work closely with our TDCJ partners.

As a reminder, while on the unit TDCJ requires facemasks to be worn at all times unless eating or drinking. Physical distancing, while encouraged, is not a recognized alternative to wearing a mask. Please ensure you are following the TDCJ mask directive and holding your fellow team members accountable.
