

SGA Meeting Minutes – November 4, 2025

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 PM by President Sahil Tonk.

Officer Updates

President – Sahil Tonk

- o Student Regent and THECB applications are now officially open and available.
- o An official email detailing these positions will be sent later this week.
- Selections will be made to send to the Texas Tech system, which will then decide among the five universities.

Legislation Overview

• Senate Resolution 25.15: Congratulatory Legislation for Chancellor Mitchell

- A congratulatory piece thanking Chancellor Mitchell for his service to the TTU System and TTUHSC upon his retirement.
- **Vote:** Passed with 100% of the vote.

• Senate Resolution 25.16: Congratulatory Legislation for Dr. Ward

- A congratulatory piece for Dr. Jennifer Ward on her promotion to Assistant Dean for Clinical Skills Education in the School of Medicine.
- **Vote:** Passed with 100% of the vote.

Open Forum – Legislative Proposals

• Jennifer Martinez – Library 2nd Floor Renovation Concerns

- o *Issue:* Students expressed concern regarding the conversion of the 2nd floor of the library into office spaces rather than individual study spaces.
- Oiscussion: Keri Shiplet and Bennett Schackmuth clarified that while there will be offices, there will also be open study spaces, a mother's nursing room, and a "one-stop shop" for student services (financial aid, etc.) to allow for in-person visits. Senators were advised they can still draft legislation to voice discontent, but construction is already underway.

• Brianna Harris – Odessa Campus Specific Issues

o *Issue:* Odessa students are requesting outdoor tables for lunch (similar to Lubbock) and have concerns regarding the dirt parking lot.

 Discussion: President Tonk and Keri Shiplet advised that while legislation is possible, speaking directly to campus contacts is often faster for facility requests like tables. Keri offered to provide contacts for the parking issue.
