

SGA Meeting Minutes – September 16, 2025

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 PM by President Sahil Tonk.

Officer Updates

President – Sahil Tonk

- Requested that absence request forms be submitted at least 24 hours in advance.
- Presented goals for the year, including active communication with the TTU System Board of Regents, other SGA presidents, and institutional faculty.
- Explained the structure of the TTU System.
- Emphasized the importance of senators using their first and last names on Zoom and keeping cameras on for attendance purposes.
- Noted that points and attendance will be uploaded weekly if possible.

- Gave a brief overview of the Finance Committee's scope, standing in for the absent chair.

- Planned to hold weekly meetings on Thursdays, beginning October 2, 2025.
- Began planning for the Senators and Subs event.

Public Relations – Update provided by Taylor Sanders (standing in for Chair Sarah Neal)

- Reviewed prior year's social media activities and discussed strategies to increase engagement.

Legislation Overview

President Tonk provided examples of past legislation, including:

- Initiatives such as a research exchange program and proportional representation for distance students.

- Genevieve Fuentes Proposed call to action for a Speech Pathology Pinning Ceremony for graduate students.
- Vickie Le Proposed congratulatory legislation for Abigail Buterbaugh on her promotion to

Program Director of the Physician Assistant Program.

- Sahil Tonk Proposed congratulatory legislation for Dr. Tedd Mitchell on his upcoming retirement as Chancellor of the TTU System.
- Arshama Dehghan Suggested congratulatory/introductory legislation for the incoming Chancellor (to be finalized pending BOR approval).
- Jordan Bishop Suggested a call to action for collaboration with nearby campuses to allow TTUHSC students access to additional study and parking resources.

Discussion followed regarding whether tuition/resource-related proposals should be framed as a call to action or a special project. It was also noted that tuition is currently under a freeze, but the resource inequity remains a valid concern.
