IPE Fall Symposium - Registration Open

Registration is open! This year's symposium is titled Piercing the Darkness of Human Trafficking: Building Trust Through Interprofessional Collaboration and Communication. Rebekah Charleston, M.Crim., will kick off the 2022 IPE Fall Symposium with her keynote, Tragedy to Triumph: A Trafficking Survivor's Perspective. Bekah Charleston will share her sex trafficking survivor's story through more than ten years of abuse and victimization at the hands of multiple pimps/traffickers. She will also discuss ways the healthcare team can engage with victims and collaborate with law enforcement and restorative services. Bekah has moved beyond her victimization to become a nationally recognized survivor leader in the anti-trafficking movement and CEO/Co-Founder of the Charleston Law Center, where she oversees pro bono legal services to survivors of sexual violence.

But First, FAFSA

The 2023–24 FAFSA form opened on October 1, 2022. So, before you head off to clinicals, settle in to watch your favorite shows, or go pick up your pumpkin spice latte, please complete the 23-24 FAFSA form to apply for all types of financial aid such as these:

- Federal grants
- Federal student loans
- State loans
- State grants
- Institutional scholarships (all HSC schools require a FAFSA to be completed as part of their scholarship applications)
- Grants and scholarships from other organizations

If you don't fill out the FAFSA form, you could be missing out on valuable financial aid.

The 2023-2024 FAFSA will be used to offer financial aid for the summer 2023, fall 2023 and spring 2024 TTUHSC semesters. You will need your 2021 Federal Income Tax return information to complete the FAFSA.

Every year, there are a number of reasons students think they shouldn't complete the FAFSA form; however, the reality is that EVERYONE who's going to college should fill it out.

So, are you ready to get started? To fill out the FAFSA form, simply visit https://studentaid.gov/h/applyfor-aid/fafsa, select the 23-24 FAFSA and fill it out on a computer or mobile device.

We will begin uploading the 23-24 FAFSAs into our system in late October/early November. This is to allow time to receive the system updates for the new award year.
