Registration Open - Shatter the Stigma 2023

Registration is now open for our first summer IPE event, Shatter the Stigma, a virtual interprofessional simulation with standardized patients. In this IPE simulation with SPs, teams of learners from diverse professional backgrounds take the first step in shattering the stigma of SUDs by learning and practicing the use of destigmatizing interviewing techniques. This is accomplished by keynote presentations and panel discussions covering team-based care in SUDs, harm reduction strategies, and interviewing strategies to destigmatize the interview. Teams of learners will then participate in 2-3 simulations with SPs, followed by a facilitated debrief. This event will be held virtually on June 23, 2023.
