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Update on Returning Academic Instruction to Campus

TTUHSC leadership has continued to evaluate the feasibility of safely resuming on-campus instruction and will continue to do so until we are all back fully on campus. Beginning July 6, specific course activities requiring special instruction or student assessment may be offered on campus with modifications to ensure the safety of our TTUHSC community. Otherwise, our oncampus academic courses will remain online throughout the summer. By May 29, your school representative will be reaching out regarding your specific program. We will continue to closely monitor the impact of COVID-19 in our campus communities. Please expect communication from President Rice-Spearman by Mid-July regarding the fall semester.

You have a significant role in protecting our TTUHSC community, as well. Please continue to practice social distancing and adhere to proper hygiene. As you return to campus, TTUHSC students are asked to wear facial coverings in common spaces and participate in daily health and wellness screenings.

CARES Act Emergency Grants

The grant application is now available, and we are ready to begin awarding grants to students who qualify. In the first round of funding, you may request up to \$1,000. Following the successful submission of your application, you will be notified of your application status within seven days (via your @ttuhsc.edu email address). Additional funding rounds will be determined at a later date. With today's global uncertainty, resiliency, grit, and an understanding of emotional wellness is critical for not only individual success, but team success as well. Join Dr. Michael Gomez, TTUHSC Center for Superheroes, as he shares insight on ways students can adapt in times of difficulty and build resiliency through creative approaches to self and team care.

Dr. Gomez's research interests are child maltreatment, foster children, autism spectrum disorders, and children/adolescents with sexual behavior problems. Dr. Gomez's has been certified as a trainer in numerous specialty areas and is one of a dozen people in the United States who makes up the Trauma and Autism Community of Practice for the NCTSN. He is also one of only a handful of people in the United States trained to assess and differentiate traumatic stress and autism spectrum disorders (ASD) in a formal psychological evaluation.
