Counseling Access to Lethal Means (CALM) Training

Join Erin McGann, Justice-Involved Veterans Coordinator from the Texas Veterans Commission for this free CALM training worth 3 CEUs for mental health practitioners. Reducing access to lethal means, such as firearms and medication, can determine whether a person at risk for suicide lives or dies. This free course focuses on how to reduce access to the methods people use to kill themselves. It covers how to: 1) identify people who could benefit from lethal means counseling, 2) ask about their access to lethal methods, and 3) work with them, and their families, to reduce access.

The policy for use of the TTUHSC tax-exempt status is covered in HSC OP 50.19 (e)(1). In that policy it states that student organizations are not placed under the institution's tax-exempt umbrella. Expenditures from an agency fund are not entitled to the institution's state sales tax exemption.
