As the fall semester nears and more of our students and team members return to campus, COVID-19 viral testing will be available to TTUHSC students and team members in Lubbock. Texas. Department of Emergency Management is providing a drive-thru test site until August 24 at the Museum of Texas Tech (8 am - 4 pm, Monday - Saturday, weather permitting). The TTUHSC Libraries are pleased to announce a limited reopening for TTUHSC students, faculty, & staff beginning Tuesday, September 1st. Library hours on all three campuses will be Monday-Friday, 7:30AM-5:00PM. In following TTUHSC policies, there will be a 50% seating capacity and all patrons are asked to follow TTUHSC safety measures such as social distancing, using hand sanitizer, and wearing masks.
