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### TTUHSC Libraries Limited Reopening

The TTUHSC Libraries are pleased to announce a limited reopening beginning Tuesday, September 1st. Only members of the TTUHSC community may enter the library. Library hours on all three campuses will be Monday-Friday, 7:30AM-5:00PM. In following TTUHSC policies, there will be a 50% seating capacity and all patrons are asked to follow TTUHSC safety measures such as social distancing, using hand sanitizer, and wearing masks. A face mask or facial covering is required at all times.

The TTUHSC Libraries will be quiet study only. Seating is limited to one person per table. Group study is not allowed at this time. No physical items (books, CDs, DVDs) will be checked out. This includes Interlibrary Loan requests. We are currently not accepting cash payments. Library fees can be paid on our website at <https://www.ttuhscl.edu/libraries>.

There are now two entrances to the Preston Smith Library in Lubbock. One entrance is through the front lobby of the Preston Smith Library and the second is through the new Pod D expansion. ## DO NO HARM - An Interprofessional Patient Safety Event (Virtual)

Teams of interprofessional students will virtually enter a hospital exam room and immediately begin to examine the scene and identify medical errors. This exercise emphasizes the importance of roles and responsibilities, and collaborative practice. By demonstrating that each student approaches the patient and the room differently, it becomes apparent how much each profession relies on the other, the importance of collaboration, and highlights the importance of eliminating risks and errors to provide quality patient care.

### **Agency Accounts Moving Off-Campus**

As part of a review of policy and procedures the Office of Student Life has been conducting this summer, we have decided to move student organization agency accounts off-campus. This will allow student organizations more freedom with collecting money, purchasing items at local or online vendors, and last-minute purchases. We have created a resource page which details the steps your student organization will need to take to apply for an EIN (Employer Identification Number), open a bank account, becoming a vendor with TTUHSC, and relevant tax information.
