DO NO HARM - An Interprofessional Patient Safety Event (Virtual)

Teams of interprofessional students will virtually enter a hospital exam room and immediately begin to examine the scene and identify medical errors. This exercise emphasizes the importance of roles and responsibilities, and collaborative practice. By demonstrating that each student approaches the patient and the room differently, it becomes apparent how much each profession relies on the other, the importance of collaboration, and highlights the importance of eliminating risks and errors to provide quality patient care.

Counseling Access to Lethal Means (CALM) Training

Join Erin McGann, Justice-Involved Veterans Coordinator from the Texas Veterans Commission for this free CALM training worth 3 CEUs for mental health practitioners. Reducing access to lethal means, such as firearms and medication, can determine whether a person at risk for suicide lives or dies. This free course focuses on how to reduce access to the methods people use to kill themselves. It covers how to: 1) identify people who could benefit from lethal means counseling, 2) ask about their access to lethal methods, and 3) work with them, and their families, to reduce access.
