2021-2022 FAFSA Opens on October 1st

The 2021-2022 FAFSA form will be available starting Thursday, October 1st. The FAFSA form is needed when applying for all types of financial aid, including federal and state grants, federal and state loans, and institutional scholarships. The 2021-2022 FAFSA form will be used to offer financial aid for the summer 2021, fall 2021, and spring 2022 TTUHSC semesters. Visist fafsa.gov and fill it out on a computer or mobile device. As a reminder, TTUHSC's FAFSA school code is 016024.
