

## **IPE Summer Escape Room Challenge - Lubbock Campus**

The Office of Interprofessional Education will be hosting a fun and engaging Escape Room this summer for Lubbock campus students. This beginner escape room is an adventurous way for new students to meet others across our various healthcare professions, improve interprofessional teamwork and communication, and collaborate together to solve puzzles that will ultimately lead to a discharge plan in a simulated patient case.

To escape the room, interprofessional teams of students will work together to solve an introductory clinical case and then discuss the teamwork and communication skills used. At least two professions must be represented on each team. Teams will have one hour to complete the challenge. Following the completion of the challenge or at the end of the hour, a debrief will take place allowing teams to discuss their escape room experience and evaluate their teams performance. Registered participants who complete the Escape Room challenge will receive a certificate that can be given to their program directors for IPE graduation credit.
